With reference to the RQ No. 3135/RQ-KOL/2009 Dated 12/06/2009 in the above mentioned application for Grant of Patent, a) Examination has been conducted under Section 12 and 13 of the Patents Act 1970, The following objections are hereby communicated

- b) Objections:
- 1 Typographic error in claims should be corrected.
- Source and geographical origin of the biological materials used in the present invention should be mentioned in the specification.
- Attention of applicant is hereby invited to section 6 of Biological Diversity Act 2002, which mandates that if a biological material procured from India is used in an application for patent, permission and other information for making an application for the patent should be obtained from the National Biodiversity Authority. The relevant application form for such permission is available in the website of national Biodiversity Authority (www.nbaindia.org) FormIII (Rule 18).
- 4 Claim no 4, 5, 6(a), 6(f) are not clear as the scope of the claims are too broad.
- Claim no 4 is not clear in respect of the expression "water or aqueous ethanol extract" as indicated therein. Claim no 6(f) is not clear in respect of the expression "oil based composition" as indicated therein.
- 6 Claim no. 4 and 6 are not clearly worded as indicated therein.
- 7 Subject matter of claim no. 6(a) does not constitute an invention according to Sec 2(1)(j) of The Act.
- 8 Subject matter of claim no. 6(a) does not constitute an invention according to Sec 2(1)(j) of The Act.

Form 1 should be submitted with declaration by the applicant (para 9 iii of submitted Form 1) clearly indicating ?The invention as disclosed in the specification uses the biological material from India and the necessary permission from the competent authority shall be submitted by me/us before the grant of patent to me/us. There is no lawful ground of objection to the grant of the Patent to me/us".
- 13 Foreign filing particulars if any should be filed with necessary petition.
- 14 A pregrant opposition under section 25(1) against the instant application has been filed by TKDL, CSIR. The detail notice of oppostion will be communicated to you shortly.
- Details regarding the search and/or examination report including claims of the application allowed, as referred to in Rule 12(3) of the Patent Rule, 2003, in respect of same or substantially the same invention filed in all the major Patent offices along with appropriate translation where applicable, should be submitted within a period of Six months from the date of receipt of this communication as provided under section 8(2) of the Indian Patents Act.
